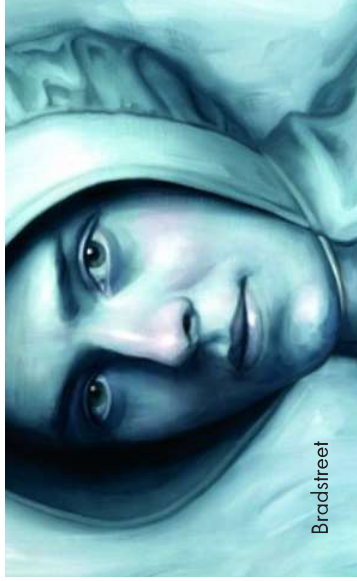


## A Few of Your Favorite Things

### Assignment:

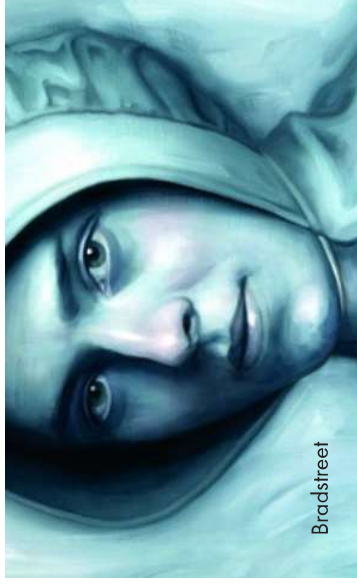
